WEEE & RoHS Directive Policy

MCS Control Systems statement on the WEEE Directive **(Waste Electrical and Electronic Equipment Regulations) 2002/96/EC and 2003/108/EC**

MCS are fully aware of our responsibilities contained within the WEEE Directive and will comply with the legislation at all times.

Further to investigations into our obligations under the WEEE Directive, it is the understanding of MCS Control Systems Limited that the equipment we produce (including control panels) is covered by some of the justifiable exemptions within the directive and therefore the company will not be responsible for the end of use disposal.

Should any of our equipment fall outside these exemptions, MCS will ensure compliance with the Directive.

The exemptions within the Directive that are relevant to MCS are as follows:

- **Fixed installations**

A control panel is vital to any fixed installation for which they are to be incorporated. The function of the installation could not be performed without the control panel being installed.

- **Large scale stationary industrial tools**

A control panel is an essential component of any large scale stationary industrial tool, such as fixed machinery or plant. The equipment would not function without the control panel being installed. The panel is therefore incorporated as part of the large scale stationary industrial tool, or the equipment could be deemed as a fixed installation (as above).

- **Equipment that is part of another type of equipment that is not within the scope of the Directive**

This generally used for items such as motor vehicles, but as previously indicated, control panels are a part of fixed installations and large scale stationary industrial tools, which are exclusions from the Directive (as described above).

If a client requires MCS to remove and dispose of redundant equipment, under a commercial agreement, we are prepared to do so and will ensure that all documentation (Waste Carrier Licence, Transfer Note, Consignment Note etc.) is supplied, ensuring the correct transportation and disposal.

Further to the WEEE Directive, MCS ensure that all suppliers comply with the ROHS Directive and confirm that all products included within our specifications will comply with the current legislation.

MCS Control Systems statement on the RoHS Directive **(Restriction of Hazardous Substances Regulations) 2002/95/EC**

MCS are fully aware of our responsibilities contained within the ROHS Directive and will comply with the legislation at all times.

MCS assemble control panels from equipment supplied to us and we ensure that all of our suppliers comply with the ROHS Directive.

We confirm that all products included within our specifications will comply with the current legislation.

This policy will be kept up to date, the policy and the way in which it has operated, will be reviewed every year.
